
CASE STATEMENT

The Diocesan Annual Appeal continues to be the single most important annual fundraising initiative for the Diocese of Scranton. Poverty, hunger, and homelessness remain serious challenges in our community; these concerns have grown exponentially because of inflation and other economic challenges throughout the eleven counties of our diocese.

We are a people committed to all the good work enabled through our unified effort of committing our time, talent and treasure to those less fortunate than ourselves. Funds raised through the Appeal provide critical financial support for Catholic Social Services, Catholic Education, Catholic Communications, vocations and priestly life, Parish Life, Faith Formation Grants and Social Justice Grants. Through our commitment and unity, we strive to bring the gift of hope to our sisters and brothers most in need.

The Appeal's beneficiaries are grouped into six key areas of focus:

CATHOLIC SOCIAL SERVICES CATHOLIC EDUCATION CATHOLIC COMMUNICATIONS VOCATIONS AND PRIESTLY LIFE PARISH AND SPIRITUAL LIFE FAITH FORMATION AND SOCIAL JUSTICE GRANTS



THE IMPORTANCE OF YOUR SUPPORT

Throughout the 2024-2025 fiscal year, we will be phasing in a significant rebranding of the *Diocesan Annual Appeal* to better align mission priorities and to share the resulting impact made possible by the generosity of our brothers and sisters who support and make possible this unified effort to sustain and grow Catholic ministries.

While the "Diocesan Annual Appeal" is familiar to most of our parishioners, many do not realize what the Appeal supports (some still refer to this initiative's prior name, the *Bishop's Annual Appeal*). This year, we will be very intentional in clarifying how these funds are used to do what no one parish can do on its own by renaming it the

<u>Catholic Ministries Appeal</u> of the Diocese of Scranton

The Appeal provides the funds necessary to support programs and ministries throughout the entire diocese. It is our job as pastors, priests, Parish Life Coordinators, Appeal Ambassadors, as well as parish and diocesan staff to educate our fellow Catholics about the good work that is accomplished through the Appeal.

As we make this important change, our primary motivation as parish leaders and diocesan staff will be to inform the faithful of the resulting *impact* made possible only through our Catholic Ministries. When we work together in unity, we can do what no one parish or individual can do on their own, and by doing so offer hope to those among us in great need.

Personalizing, publicizing and speaking positively of the Appeal must focus primarily on the *impact* and what we support throughout our diocese; when you talk with fellow parishioners and friends, please share with them the good work of Catholic Ministries throughout our diocese and share with them your support of the Appeal.

As parish leaders, we have a lot of work in front of us. We need to educate ourselves about the Appeal and the ministries it supports, so that we can speak about them with confidence. It is important that we review the Appeal materials, so that we understand all the tasks that need to be done to make the Appeal a success in our parish. We need to make sure that ALL parishioners are provided the opportunity to give to the Appeal.

Finally, please pray for the success of the Appeal. Pray for those we talk with, that they may open their hearts and their minds and listen to God's call. Pray for a positive spirit in your parish toward the Appeal and pray that we can complete the work that God has sent us forth to accomplish.

LEADERSHIP ROLES

THE PASTOR

Thank you for your constant effort in supporting the Diocesan Annual Appeal / Catholic Ministries Appeal. The pastor's ownership and engaged support of the Appeal is the single most important factor in a parish's success.

What does your role entail?

- Pray for the success of this campaign
- Make your gift to this year's Appeal
- Present the Appeal in a positive and enthusiastic manner
- Appoint an Appeal Ambassador*
 - *It is strongly recommended that the Appeal Ambassador be someone other than the Pastor. Ideally, this appointee possesses leadership qualities, is comfortable speaking to others about Catholic Ministries and the resulting impact of donating to this fundraising initiative. Look to existing parish leadership donors and those who are already providing generous support to the Appeal.
- Review your parish weekly progress report (*this year, these reports will be delivered on Saturday mornings).
- Identify two areas where your parish benefits from the Appeal or can in the future (see Appendix A: DAA 2024 Leading with Impact) AND share those stories with your parish community; review the Appeal videos to select one that will resonate most with your parishioners.
- Encourage participation: "Our goal is 100% participation!"
- Thank parishioners for their support! (Informally, through conversations and in sending forth at the conclusion of liturgy when you notice they recently donated to the Appeal; Formally, through handwritten correspondence or an email acknowledging their gifts to the Appeal and extending your personal thanks)

APPEAL AMBASSADOR

Thank you for sharing your talent and time! You will assist your pastor and parish community in reaching your parish goal by inviting and educating parishioners on the importance of the Annual Appeal.

What does your role entail?

- Pray for the success of this campaign and make a gift to the Appeal
- Ensure your parish website is up to date (remove old Appeal information and post this year's graphics; remove notices and outdated information as appropriate)
- Present the Appeal in a positive and enthusiastic manner
- Ensure posters are displayed and updated throughout the campaign, and graphics are used in the parish bulletin and on social media
- Serve as coordinators for Celebration Weekend, ensuring that the Appeal video can be shown and that the parish is prepared to distribute and collect in-pew envelopes
- Visit all Parish councils, societies, and other ministries, speak about the importance of participation in the Appeal, and distribute and collect materials/envelopes
- Keep the invitation open and look for personal invitation moments with other leaders, parish families, and parish groups
- Assist the Pastor/Parish Life Coordinator by having regular discussion about Appeal progress and assist in preparing any acknowledgements and thanking donors for their support (*the Diocese of Scranton Development Office will send formal acknowledgment letters and tax receipts, but this personalized approach to thanking donors at your parish is also good practice.).

PARISH STAFF

Thank you for your commitment to our local church! You will assist your pastor by promoting the Annual Appeal to your parish community.

What does your role entail?

- Pray for the success of this campaign and make a gift to the Appeal
- Present the Appeal in a positive and enthusiastic manner
- Review your parish weekly progress report (*this year, these reports will be delivered on Saturday mornings). Assist the pastor in acknowledging those who have given to the Appeal.
- Display posters in visible places
- See that graphics are used in the parish bulletin and on social media each week and that the parish website is kept up to date.
- Assist with Celebration Weekend if necessary

KEYS TO SUCCESS

STEP 1 - Commitment Weekend Overview

- □ Focus on Diocesan Annual Appeal/Catholic Ministries Appeal at the normal Mass starting time before the beginning of Mass or as preferred by the Pastor.
- □ Call attention to the DAA/CMA Commitment Weekend.
- □ Show the DAA/CMA Video. (See scripts)
- □ Encourage parishioners to complete the pledge form.
- \Box Mention parish goal.

STEP 2 – DAA/CMA Presentation

- \Box Give thanks for the support from previous years.
- □ Share what the DAA/CMA funds (Catholic education, seminarian formation, Catholic Social Services, Parish Life, Communications, Faith Formation and Social Justice grants).
- \Box Mention parish goal.
- □ Mention the goal of increasing parish participation by 5% (or 10%, or 15%)

STEP 3 – DAA/CMA Video

□ Let us take a moment to listen and watch a video that highlights how your gifts impact the programs and ministries of the Church that support our friends and neighbors throughout the Diocese.

STEP 4 - In-Pew Gift Reflection and Pledge

- □ Thank parishioners for their attention to the video.
- □ Remind parishioners that 100% of their gift supports these ministries only.
- □ Ask parishioners to pray for these ministries.
- □ Encourage parishioners to submit a pledge card today.
- □ Walk through pledge cards with parishioners.
- \Box Collect pledge cards.
- □ Thank parishioners.

TALKING POINTS FOR IN PEW COLLECTION

We ask that all parishes carry out in-pew presentations from the ambo/pulpit during all Masses on Celebration Weekend. The in-pew presentation is an opportunity to share information about the ministries and services available to the parishes and communities within our Diocese, and the importance of supporting those ministries through the Annual Appeal.

The most effective in-pew presentations are delivered by the pastor and use the Appeal video. If you are challenged to show the Appeal video, please contact the Office of Development for assistance at (570) 207-2250.

Please remember to remind parishioners of the importance of their participation – no matter how great or small the gift. Remain positive and treat the process as a celebration.

The following is a suggested script that can be delivered by the pastor:

Good morning! Today, we celebrate Celebration Weekend for the Catholic Ministries Appeal (formerly the Diocesan Annual Appeal). The Appeal's theme again this year is "Our Call to Serve" and it takes on new life by pointing us towards the future. Last year, we were remined that *Our Call to Serve* encourages a spirit of creating communities rooted in the Life of Jesus Christ. Each of us are called to become the loving, compassionate Christ who fed the hungry. This year, added to our theme, we are reminded of Jesus' message in the Gospel of John, that he came so that we all "might have life and have it more abundantly.

As Christ gave Himself to us, we are called to serve and be generous towards others. As a parishioner within the Diocese of Scranton, I invite you to join me in serving others through the Diocesan Annual Appeal. I want to take a moment to show you a video that inspires me by revealing some of the significant impacts of this effort and shows how our parish, united with the other parishes throughout our diocese, is *Answering the Call to Serve*...

(Show the Appeal Video.)

There are several ways we can contribute to the Appeal. Many of you have already received information in the mail that included a pledge card. If you have already filled that out and sent it in or have made your gift online, thank you!

If you are here today and have not yet given, there is a pledge card in the pew that you can either fill out and place in the collection basket, or you can scan the QR code on the pledge card to make your gift online. Please consider what you might contribute to these vital Catholic ministries over the next several months. We'll now take a few minutes to complete these cards.

(Please provide time for parishioners to complete the cards – suggestion is 3 to 5 minutes).

Thank you again for joining me in support of Catholic Ministries. Our generous gifts, combined with the gifts of all our brothers and sisters throughout *our* diocese, go a long way in supporting *our* Church. I encourage you to look at the ad shared in today's bulletin that will provide further information about the Appeal and the impact that you make possible because of your generosity.

SAMPLE CAMPAIGN CADENCE AND ACTIVITIES

It can be difficult to "get started." Here are some suggestions for timing of activities that can help you be successful in your efforts to reach your parish goal.

Beginning in early September:

- Place *Our Call to Serve Catholic Ministries Appeal* ads in your bulletin and on social media if your parish could run this ad for a few weeks leading up to Celebration Weekend, it will help!
- Remind parishioners that they will be receiving materials from the Diocese to make their gifts.
- Emphasize that gifts do not have to be made immediately; **pledges** that can be paid over several months have helped reach the goal more quickly.
- Stress that gifts of *any size* are welcome, and that *participation* is important.
- Hang your Appeal Goal posters in prominent locations; Appeal Ambassadors, Pastors and members of councils should build excitement by sharing *impact* stories of Catholic Ministries.
- Appeal Ambassadors should begin attending parish council, society, and ministry meetings.

Weekend of September 14/15:

- Place "Celebration Weekend is next weekend" ad in your bulletin and on social media.
- Stress that gifts of *any size* are welcome, and that *participation* is important.
- Share any social media posts from the Diocese on your parish's social media.

Weekend of September 21/22:

- Show one of this year's Appeal videos during all Masses this weekend.
- Pastor is asked to focus his homily on how tens of thousands of people throughout our diocese and beyond benefit from the Catholic ministries supported by the Annual Appeal and how parish support is critical to the success of the Appeal.
- Have in pew envelopes distributed.
- Place "Celebration Weekend" ad in bulletin.
- Stress that gifts of *any size* are welcome, and that *participation* is important.

October:

- Place an ad of your choice in your bulletin AND/OR publicize progress toward goal in the bulletin please try to complete at least one of these action items every week!
- Make an announcement that parishioners will receive a letter from you during the month to make their gift to the Appeal.
- Share as many social media stories pertaining to the Appeal as you can.

November

- Place an ad of your choice in your bulletin AND/OR publicize progress toward goal in the bulletin please try to complete at least one of these action items every week!
- Encourage parishioners to make their gift before the end of the month to help your parish get to its goal as well as to close out the Appeal before the Advent/Christmas Season.
- Coordinate with Appeal Ambassador to carry out parish plan for achieving its goal.

December

• If your parish has not made it to your goal, please continue, at your discretion, to publicize progress in your bulletin and/or through announcements at Mass.

January/February/March

- If your parish has not made it to your goal, please continue, at your discretion, to publicize progress in your bulletin and/or through announcements at Mass.
- If your parish is close to its goal, we're happy to work with you to help you reach your goal by personalizing bulletin ads, sending letters to outstanding donors in your parish, etc.
- You can also include an envelope in your parish envelope packet for the Appeal during any or all of these months.

The Diocesan Development Office is happy to work with you in whatever way you see fit to help your parish reach goal. <u>We are a resource for you and your parish</u>, and we're all happy to help you in any way that we can.

SUGGESTED PETITIONS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

APPEAL PARISH REPORTS

The Development Office will email weekly parish reports every Saturday, beginning August 17, 2024. A notification from the diocesan database (Donor Perfect) will be delivered to the email addresses on record for your parish until the first gift for this year's Appeal has been recorded. Once gifts have been recorded, the reports will continue through the end of the rebate period and include a list of parishioners who have participated by offering a gift or committed by pledge. Additionally, these reports will provide a real-time progress report of commitments vs. goal as well as cash received and a calculation of anticipated rebate.

Pastors, Appeal Ambassadors, Parish Life Coordinators and Assistant Pastors are encouraged to review thank those who have supported the Appeal.

LEADING WITH IMPACT Gifts to the Catholic Ministries Appeal have a far-reaching impact!

Vocations:

- The Diocese of Scranton currently has **10 seminarians** discerning a possible call to the Priesthood (4 are natives of Luzerne County; 3 are natives of Lackawanna County; 3 are natives of Monroe County)
- There are two Diaconate Classes currently in formation with **18 candidates and aspirants** (6 are from Lackawanna and Monroe County respectively; 4 from Luzerne Co. & 2 from Pike County)

Catholic Social Services:

- Saint Vincent de Paul Kitchen in Wilkes-Barre served 107,832 meals during the 2023 calendar year
- A total of **25,231 families and individuals** received assistance from a Catholic Social Services operated food pantry last year (11,812 households served in Carbondale; 8,050 households in Wilkes-Barre; 5,369 individuals assisted in Hazleton)
- The three emergency shelters operated by Catholic Social Services provided **15,701 individual nights of shelter** to people experiencing homelessness (6,503 nights in Scranton; 5,388 nights in Wilkes-Barre; 3,810 nights in Hazleton)
- Saint Francis Commons, which is a transitional housing facility for homeless veterans in Scranton, assisted **25 veterans** last year. Saint Hedwig's Veterans Village, which provides apartments for veterans and their dependent families, assisted **15 veterans** in 2023.
- Catholic Social Services addresses the needs of children, parents and families by offering education and support programs through an ongoing partnership with Children & Youth in Luzerne County. In 2023, a total of **1,202** families were served in Luzerne County.
- Before Christmas 2023, Catholic Social Services, working in partnership with other community organizations, provided presents and gifts to **6,151 children** in Scranton, Carbondale and Hazleton.
- Catholic Social Services provides five immigration and refugee support programs, many of which are recognized by the U.S. Department of Justice. Our Refugee Resettlement Program welcomes families from different countries, directly assisting families with critical needs like rent, food, clothing, employment and more. Immigration Program services help clients navigate the complex legal processes that lead to lawful immigration status and citizenship. In 2023, **1,026 refugees** were assisted and **138 immigrants** served.

Catholic Schools:

- For the current school year (2024-2025), the Diocese of Scranton currently has more than **4,500 students**
- The Diocese of Scranton operates **15 Catholic Elementary Schools** and **4 Catholic High Schools** (7 are in Luzerne County; 6 are in Lackawanna County; 2 each in Monroe, Bradford & Lycoming Co.)
- Graduates of the Class of 2024 earned more than **1,140 scholarships** earning **\$64 million** toward their future schooling
