Lighten burdens by making room for the Lord, Pope Francis says on First Sunday of Advent



Despite the problems and worries in the world, Jesus invites Christians to look toward heaven, trust in his saving love and make room for him in order to find hope again, Pope Francis said.


"Sadness is awful," he told visitors gathered in St. Peter's Square for the Angelus Dec. 1, the first Sunday of Advent.

"Indeed, it can happen that the anxiety, fears and worries about our personal lives or about what is happening in the world today weigh down on us like boulders and throw us into discouragement ... and induce us to close in on ourselves," he said.

"Jesus' invitation is this: raise your head high and keep your hearts light and awake," he said, reflecting on the day's Gospel reading from St. Luke, which speaks about "cosmic upheavals and anxiety and fear in humanity."

Hundreds of young adults attend 2024 Diocesan Youth Rally

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe celebration to take place at Cathedral on Sunday



The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is of great importance for the entire Church, and is celebrated with great enthusiasm by our Hispanic brothers and sisters.

It marks the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1531 to Juan Diego, a poor, humble, indigenous Mexican peasant who had recently converted to the Catholic faith. These miraculous events resulted in Our Lady of Guadalupe being recognized as "Patroness of the Americas."

Parishes around the Diocese of Scranton will be holding numerous celebrations over the coming days - including a special Mass this Sunday, Dec. 8, at 12:15 p.m. at the Cathedral of Saint Peter in Scranton. The Mass, which will be celebrated by Bishop Joseph C. Bambera, is being planned by the Saint Teresa of Calcutta Parish community in South Scranton.

Following the Mass, the parish will be hosting a Guadalupe festival at the Diocesan Pastoral Center.

On the Feast Day itself, on Tuesday December 12, the parish will continue its celebration with a procession beginning at 3:30 a.m. at the Cathedral of Saint Peter, and concluding at 4:30 a.m. at Sacred Hearts Church on Prospect Avenue for morning prayers led by a mariachi band, followed by an early Mass at 6:30am.

U.S. Basilicas, churches to ring bells at the moment Notre Dame Cathedral reopens




As Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris officially reopens Dec. 7-8, bells will ring in churches an ocean away in the United States to celebrate the historic moment.

The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington has invited local churches to toll their bells Dec. 7 at 2 p.m. EST, when the two-day reopening ceremonies — led by Archbishop Laurent Ulrich of Paris, and attended by dozens of dignitaries, including France's President Emmanuel Macron, U.S. first lady Jill Biden, and U.S. President-elect Donald Trump — will begin.

Locally, churches including the Cathedral of Saint Peter in downtown Scranton, and the Basilica Shrine to Saint Ann in West Scranton, will be among the local churches ringing their bells this weekend to celebrate the official reopening of Notre Dame Cathedral.

Pope Francis receives new all-electric Popemobile



Pope Francis received a new, emission-free, all-electric popemobile from representatives of Mercedes-Benz, the German car manufacturer that has been supplying vehicles for the popes for nearly 100 years.

"We are overjoyed to be able to fulfill the Holy Father's wish for an electric popemobile and are particularly proud to be able to build the vehicle according to his requirements," Britta Seeger, head of sales and marketing and member of the board of management of Mercedes-Benz Group AG, said in a press release Dec. 4.

It is the first time the company has manufactured an all-electric popemobile and "this cooperation ... is a valuable symbol of sustainable change together," she said.

The pope met with the representatives, which included engineers who led the project, in a courtyard at the Vatican.
