## **About the Speaker:**

Fr. Joseph McShane, S.J., originally from New York City, entered the Society of Jesus in 1967 and was ordained a priest in 1977. With a doctorate in the history of Christianity, Fr. McShane has taught numerous courses in religious studies throughout his career. Fr. McShane had served as the President of the University of Scranton from 1998-2003 and most recently as President of Fordham University from 2003-2022.

Fr. McShane retired from Fordham University in 2022 and was named President Emeritus by the Board of Trustees. In 2024, Fr. McShane received the Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C. Award from the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities. Currently, Fr. McShane is the Superior of the Jesuit community in Scranton, PA.
